

**Mark Hoyer** is the Director of the Florida LAKEWATCH program in the UF/IFAS School of Forest Resources and Conservation, Fisheries and Aquatic Sciences. He received a Bachelor of Science in Fisheries and Wildlife Biology from Iowa State University; his Master of Science in Limnology is from the University of Missouri, Columbia. He has worked extensively on the interrelationships of water chemistry, aquatic macrophyte communities, fish populations, and aquatic bird populations. In Iowa and Missouri, his primary interest was lake eutrophication, including nutrient loading models and the relationship between in-lake nutrients and chlorophyll a.
