The Florida Lake Management Society will be hosting the 12th Annual Southeastern Lakes Management Conference in Orlando, Florida on June 2-5, 2003 at the Hyatt Orlando-Kissimmee, approximately 3 miles from the main entrance to Disney World. This Conference will combine the annual meeting and conference of the Florida Lake Management Society with the annual Southeastern Lakes Management Conference. Concurrent technical sessions will be held on a wide variety of topics related to water resources and lake management issues. Technical

workshops and field trips to local projects are also planned. An attendance of 300-400 participants is expected.

Abstract Submittal DEADLINE MARCH 3, 2003

Abstract Format: Please prepare in WordPerfect or Microsoft Word formats. You may submit your abstract by e-mail or U.S. mail to the Program Chair, Harvey Harper.

TITLE: USE ALL CAPS

AUTHORS: Provide name(s) and affiliation(s) of author(s) including addresses, phone and fax numbers and E-mail addresses. If more than one author, please underline name of presenting author.

BODY:

The body of the Abstracts should state the purpose, results and relevant conclusions of the paper. Abstracts should not exceed 250 words!

Authors in oral sessions are required to use a PowerPoint format for their presentation. Overhead and 35 mm projectors will NOT be available at the Conference. Each session room will be equipped with a computer, LCD projector, and operator. Digital copies of presentations must be submitted to the Session Chairperson no later than 1 week prior to the Conference for insertion onto each session computer. Connection of individual computers to the session equipment will not be allowed. **ACCEPTANCE** NOTIFICATION WILL BE **MADE BY MARCH 24,** 2003.

All authors of conference papers will be required to submit a 2-page extended Abstract by May 1, 2003 for inclusion into a Conference Proceedings, which will be distributed at the Conference. Details for preparing the extended Abstract will be provided with the Acceptance Notification. Conference fees are NOT waived for contributing authors, and all presenters are required to register for the full Conference.
