28th International Symposium of the North American Lake Management Society Lake Louise, Alberta, Canada



The Florida Lake Management Society was well represented at the 28th International Symposium of the North American Lake Management Society held in November 2008 in Lake Louise, Alberta, Canada. Five members of our state society attended, gave papers/posters, and attended workshops, etc., and had a great time being

entertained and educated by the Canadian host committee and attendees. As a special note, more than 20 scientists attended from Mexico - a first for the Society. Papers given by Florida attendees included a wide range of topics such as the limitations of the TSI statistic, water reuse and the potential for waterway impairment, lack of impact of Hydrilla on community metrics, affects of dredging on long term water quality of shallow lakes, and long term water quality changes in the Choctawhatchee Estuary system. Florida attendees included Harvey Harper (ERD, outgoing NALMS Region 4 Director), Vickie Hoge (SJRWMD), Julie Terrell (Okaloosa-Walton College Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance and a FLMS Director), Ann Shortelle (MACTEC, incoming NALMS Region 4 Director), and Mark Hoyer (University of Vickie Hoge, Julie Terrell, Ann Shortelle and Mark Florida and NALMS President Elect).

Love Your Lake Cost Share Program

Love Your Lake Deadline March 1, 2009

FLMS has created a cost-share program that funds lake, pond and shoreline projects demonstrating management techniques that help protect, preserve and restore Florida's aquatic resources. Each year FLMS solicits grant proposals describing successful management projects. FLMS will provide matching funds for expenses incurred by the selected applicant. Expenditures may be in the form of labor or monetary contributions utilized in the program. Proposals are reviewed by a selection committee based on the following criteria:

Monetary or labor match—programs encouraging community involvement are strongly recommended.

<u>Location</u> — project must be accessible to the public (may include large communities or neighborhoods—dependent on accessibility).

<u>Signage</u> — educational component explaining project.

Water quality enhancements — examples include xeriscaping, lake-water irrigation, environmental berm and swale, and other innovative erosion control techniques.

"Love Your Lake" project proposals must be submitted by March 1, 2009. Projects must be completed by May 1, 2010. If you have any questions, please e-mail Ann Shortelle at
